#### R – <u>Read the Text (1 Thess. 2:5-8)</u>

"For we never came with flattering speech, as you know, nor with a pretext for greed—God is witness— nor did we seek glory from men, either from you or from others, even though as apostles of Christ we might have asserted our authority. But we proved to be gentle among you, as a nursing mother tenderly cares for her own children. Having so fond an affection for you, we were wellpleased to impart to you not only the gospel of God but also our own lives, because you had become very dear to us."

### W – Work on Application

Breaking barriers for the gospel is not about being a politician, salesman, or expert. but about sharing the gospel message and showing others that we genuinely care about them enough to not only tell them what Jesus did for them, but to show them in the way we love and serve them.
